OVERVIEW OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

The School District of Mystery Lake is a public education system that serves Thompson students. There is six elementary schools and one high school, and French Immersion and Cree bilingual is offered within the district. The district has approximately 3000 students and employs over 475 people across the district.

In the School District of Mystery Lake we:

- Provide public education
- Employ teachers and support staff to provide education and services in our system
- Manage a variety of spaces that are used by the public
- Communicate through district phone message system and district and school websites

ACCESSIBILITY ACHIEVEMENTS

A review of the School District of Mystery Lake's existing practices, procedures and facilities was conducted and a list of achievements with respect to accessibility was created. These are:

- Appropriate education procedure
- Transportation procedure updated to meet student services legislation
- Inclusion philosophy
- Improved building access
- Gender neutral washrooms
- Accessible parking
- Play structures in some school grounds have accessibility pieces to them
- Cultural proficiency training for all staff to address attitudinal barriers
- Variety of classroom furnishings to address different learning styles and needs
- Sound field systems available in all K-3 classrooms and others as required
- Schools have blinking light system for announcements and emergencies
- Change room upgrades in all schools to improve privacy and feeling of safety
- Sensory resources readily available eg. noise reducing headphones, Boardmaker, chewllery, blue tooth sound amplification systems for public use at District and Community events
- Schools have suggestion boxes located in the office specifically to address how customer service and accessibility can be improved

ACCESSIBILITY BARRIERS

A review of the School District of Mystery Lake's existing practices, procedures and facilities was conducted and a list of barriers with respect to accessibility was created. These are:

- Accessible washrooms
- Consistent signage
- Door sizes not wide enough in some cases
- Online application process
- No statements regarding documents being available in different formats
- No statements regarding asking for help if required
- Accommodations for low vision or hearing impairments during public events/presentations
- Accessibility designated parking spots for staff and public in all locations
- Education regarding accessibility for staff
- Size of print in publications
- In classroom path of motion is limited or non-existent in some cases
- Stairs only access to some areas in some buildings
- Counter height in some buildings at reception area, kitchens and washrooms
